SOME FEATURES OF THE SECTOR IN SPAIN:

- Spain has the **2nd largest number of biotech related companies in the world**, according to the latest OECD data.
- **628 companies** worked exclusively in biotechnology during 2014, while over **2,700 companies used biotechnology** in some of their processes.
- In 2014 there were over 177,000 jobs in the sector, 9,795 of which were in biotechnology R&D. In terms of the sectorial distribution of biotechs, most of them work in **human health** (61.9%) and the **food sector** (28.8%).
- Leader in **personalised medicine** and the development of innovative drug for the treatment of **cancer, Alzheimer's, autoimmune and infectious diseases**.
- Members of ASEBIO have **21 drugs in Registration stage**, 123 in Phase II, 117 in Phase II and 76 in Phase I.
- European leader in GMO crops cultivation and stands third in the **agrobiotechnology**.
- Fifth in the **biochemistry** and **molecular biology** chapters worldwide.
- World leader in **marine biotechnology**.
- **Biospain** was the biggest country-based biotech event in Europe.
- **Biolatam** is the largest biotechnology partnering event in Latin America.
- In 2015, ASEBIO members **launched 98 products or services** and took part in **182 alliances**.
- Spain continued in the **top ten for scientific production** in biotechnology according to the latest SCImago Country Rank data (2014).
